## IN SEARCH OF THE PERFECT NAP

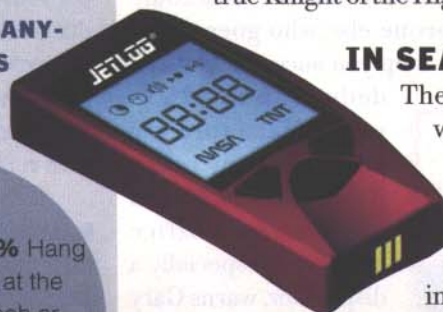
There's no shortage of technologies being developed to warn a driver that his eyelids are too heavy for toothpicks.

It can be used as a stand-alone unit or with certain handheld computers. By waking up the user at just the right time, it prevents the excessive grogginess and sleep pattern disruption that can result from a nap that goes off the deep end.
